- The estimated food insecurity rate for Adair County is **16.0%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 33.3%, from 6 to 4 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **35.9%** (29.4%-42.3%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 29% of people in Adair County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 15.4% (8.7%-25.9%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Adair County increased by 829 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net in migration** of **715** people.<sup>4</sup>
- American, 0.3% Asian, 1.5% other and 2 or more races, and 1.8% Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Adair County is **projected** to **decrease** by -272 people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Adair County are **projected** to **increase** by **40.6%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>





In 2016, Adair County's official poverty rate was **26.1%** (21.4% - 30.8%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>

- In 2017, there were 6 child care centers in Adair County. Of these 6 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, **2.1%** (+/-0.6%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 14% people in Adair County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>



In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Adair County was \$53,369,000.13

- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 25.9% was the value of crops and 74.1% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$41,937** compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Adair County, there were **959** hired farm labor workers on **339** farms.<sup>13</sup>
- 92.3% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>




