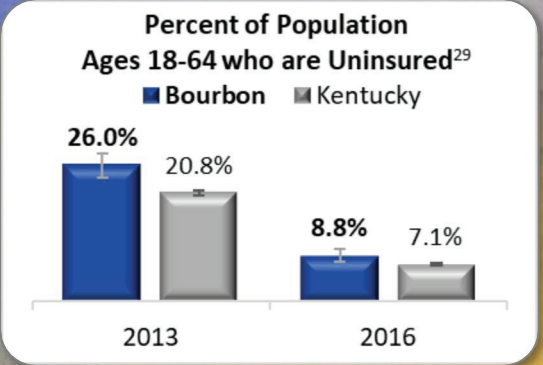

- The estimated food insecurity rate for Bourbon County is **14.1%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores **did not change** by **0.0%**, from **4** to **4** stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **32.1%** (24.8%-40.6%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **32%** of people in Bourbon County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- **N/A** (N/A-N/A) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>

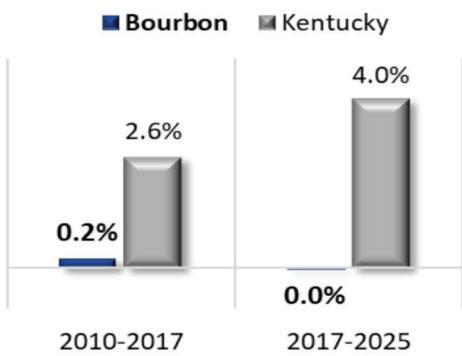

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Bourbon County **increased** by **44** people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net out migration** of **-27** people.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2016, the composition of Bourbon County's population is estimated to be **85.3%** White, **5.8%** Black/African American, **0.3%** Asian, **2.0%** other and 2 or more races, and **6.6%** Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Bourbon County is **projected** to **decrease** by **-2** people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Bourbon County are **projected** to **increase** by **43.5%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>



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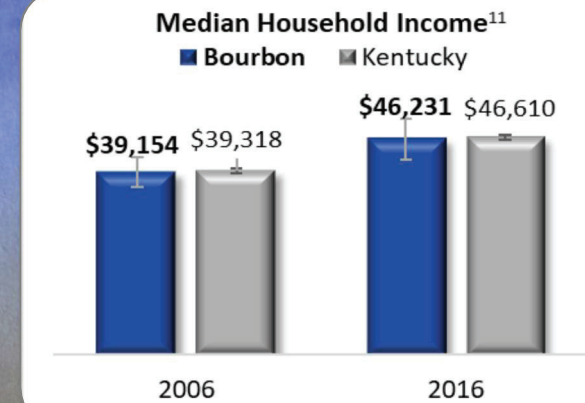

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- In 2016, Bourbon County's official poverty rate was **17.6%** (14.5% - 20.7%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>
- In 2017, there were **13** child care centers in Bourbon County. Of these **8** were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, **6.3%** (+/-1.0%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **17%** people in Bourbon County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>

- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Bourbon County was **147** for goods-producing, **358** for service-providing, and **50** for hospitality & leisure.<sup>18</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the **8,933** (+/- 365) workers ages 16 and over, **54.0%** (+/- 3.3%) worked inside the county, **45.3%** (+/-0.7%) worked outside the county and **0.7%** (+/-0.7%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, **2.1%** (+/-0.9%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- 12.7%** of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.<sup>19</sup>

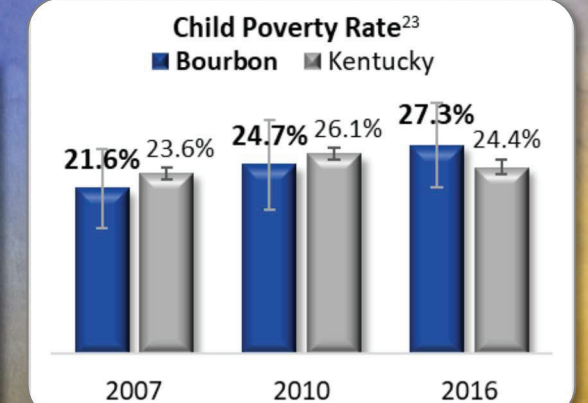

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Bourbon County was **\$108,448,000**.<sup>13</sup>
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **34.5%** was the value of crops and **65.5%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$139,976** compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Bourbon County, there were **2,242** hired farm labor workers on **411** farms.<sup>13</sup>
- 83.9%** of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>

\* A farm must sell at least \$5,000 to be defined as a farm operation.

**19.5%** of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).<sup>21</sup>

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated **182** (+/-97) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.<sup>7</sup>
- 44.7%** of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in Bourbon County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.<sup>22</sup>
- 1,308** (+/- 213) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security Income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).<sup>7</sup>
