- The estimated food insecurity rate for Bracken County is **14.6%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 50.0%, from 2 to 1 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **30.7%** (25.2%-36.4%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 23% of people in Bracken County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 7.8% (3.7%-15.8%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>



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

In 2016, Bracken County's official poverty rate was 16.7% (13.7% - 19.7%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>

- In 2017, there were 4 child care centers in Bracken County. Of these 4 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, **1.9%** (+/-0.7%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 14% people in Bracken County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>



In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Bracken County was \$10,887,000.<sup>13</sup>

- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 62.5% was the value of crops and 37.5% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$20,963** compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Bracken County, there were **589** hired farm labor workers on **156** farms.<sup>13</sup>
- 92.7% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>

\* A farm must sell at least \$5,000 to be defined as a farm operation.



- county, **51.6%** (+/-3.2%) worked outside the county and **14.0%** (+/-3.2%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup> Between 2012 and 2016, 5.4% (+/-2.2%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- **19.0%** of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.<sup>19</sup>


