
## **Caldwell County Data Profile**



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Caldwell County is **15.5%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 40.0%, from 5 to 3 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **30.6%** (24.6%-37.1%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 29% of people in Caldwell County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 16.2% (6.5%-35.0%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Caldwell County decreased by -345 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net out migration** of **-191** people.<sup>4</sup>
- American, 0.3% Asian, 1.6% other and 2 or more races, and 1.7% Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Caldwell County is **projected** to **decrease** by -98 people.<sup>3</sup>
- County are **projected** to **increase** by **17.4%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>



In 2016, Caldwell County's official poverty rate was 20.4% (17.0% - 23.8%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>

- In 2017, there were 6 child care centers in Caldwell County. Of these 4 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, **0.2%** (+/-0.4%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 16% people in Caldwell County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>



- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Caldwell County was \$38,500,000.13
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 86.7% was the value of crops and 13.3% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$80,789 compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Caldwell County, there were **314** hired farm labor workers on **115** farms.<sup>13</sup>
- **91.6%** of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>





- **26.4%** of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.<sup>19</sup>
