These secondary data profiles supplement the survey, focus groups, and key informant interviews conducted in each county across the state through the County Extension Offices and coordinated by Community and Economic Development Initiative of Kentucky (CEDIK).

The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:


- To gain a better understanding of the county's pressing issues;

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
- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Carter County decreased by -576 people.²
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated <u>net out migration</u> of -890 people.⁴
- In 2016, the composition of Carter County's population is estimated to be **96.8%** White, **0.6%** Black/African American, **0.2%** Asian, **1.1%** other and 2 or more races, and **1.2%** Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Carter County is projected to decrease by -727 people.³
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Carter County are **projected** to **increase** by **27.0%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.³




- In 2016, Carter County's official poverty rate was **22.6%** (18.4% 26.8%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸
- In 2017, there were 6 child care centers in Carter County. Of these 3 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, 0.9% (+/-0.4%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that 13% people in Carter County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Carter County was \$9,495,000.¹³
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **32.7%** was the value of crops and **67.3%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$17,896 compared to \$62,002 for the state. 13
- In Carter County, there were **496** hired farm labor workers on **159** farms. ¹³
- 91.1% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³





- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Carter County was **63** for goods-producing, **431** for service-providing, and **41** for hospitality & leisure. ¹⁸
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the **9,742** (+/- 504) workers ages 16 and over, **50.7%** (+/- 4.0%) worked inside the county, **37.7%** (+/-2.3%) worked outside the county and **11.7%** (+/-2.3%) worked outside Kentucky.⁷
- Between 2012 and 2016, **3.9%** (+/-1.8%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.⁷
- 21.5% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.¹⁹

15.4% of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).²¹

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated 337 (+/-124) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.⁷
- **50.1%** of 3rd grade students in Carter County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.²²
- **2,433** (+/- 348) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).⁷



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Carter County is 16.1%, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by **36.4%**, from **11** to **7** stores. ¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, 36.8% (32.2%-41.6%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 52% of people in Carter County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- **22.7%** (16.3%-30.7%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵
