- The estimated food insecurity rate for Crittenden County is **14.2%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores did not change by 0.0%, from 3 to 3 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **29.2%** (21.8%-37.2%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 23% of people in Crittenden County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- **10.0%** (4.3%-21.6%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Crittenden County decreased by -231 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net out migration** of -97 people.<sup>4</sup>
- American, 0.2% Asian, 1.5% other and 2 or more races, and 1.0% Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Crittenden County are **projected** to **increase** by **12.2%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>







In 2016, Crittenden County's official poverty rate was 18.6% (14.7% - 22.5%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>

- In 2017, there were 4 child care centers in Crittenden County. Of these 3 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 7.0% (+/-2.4%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 13% people in Crittenden County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>



In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Crittenden County was \$31,560,000.<sup>13</sup>

- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 63.0% was the value of crops and 37.0% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$52,178** compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Crittenden County, there were **313** hired farm labor workers on **113** farms.<sup>13</sup>
- 89.7% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>




