

- The estimated food insecurity rate for Fayette County is 15.6%, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores increased by 5.3%, from 76 to 80 stores.
- In 2013-2015, 20.0% (18.0%-22.3%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 23% of people in Fayette County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- 12.2% (9.3%-15.8%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵

The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:


- To gain a better understanding of the county's pressing issues;

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Fayette County increased by 26,156 people.²
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net in migration** of **12,718** people.⁴
- In 2016, the composition of Fayette County's population is estimated to be 71.9% White, 14.7% Black/African American, 3.9% Asian, 2.6% other and 2 or more races, and 6.9% Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Fayette County is projected to increase by 32,359 people.³
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Fayette County are projected to increase by 73.9% compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.3





- In 2016, Fayette County's official poverty rate was 17.9% (16.6% 19.2%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸
- In 2017, there were **190** child care centers in Fayette County. Of these **107** were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, 12.1% (+/-0.4%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **21%** people in Fayette County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Fayette County was \$176,241,000.¹³
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **7.7%** was the value of crops and **92.3%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$283,878 compared to \$62,002 for the state. 13
- In Fayette County, there were **2,815** hired farm labor workers on **375** farms.¹³
- 69.5% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state. 13



- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Fayette County was **1,144** for goods-producing, **9,564** for service-providing, and **1,045** for hospitality & leisure. ¹⁸
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the **156,659** (+/- 1,549) workers ages 16 and over, **84.4%** (+/- 0.7%) worked inside the county, **14.6%** (+/-0.2%) worked outside the county and **1.1%** (+/-0.2%) worked outside Kentucky.⁷
- Between 2012 and 2016, **3.4%** (+/-0.4%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.⁷
- 7.3% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state. 19

23.6% of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).²¹

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated **2,545** (+/-397) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.⁷
- **48.5%** of 3rd grade students in Fayette County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.²²
- **18,245** (+/- 1,346) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).⁷
