

- The estimated food insecurity rate for Fulton County is 21.6%, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 33.3%, from 3 to 2 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, 30.5% (23.9%-37.5%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 34% of people in Fulton County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- N/A (N/A-N/A) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>


The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Fulton County decreased by -621 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net out migration** of **-457** people.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2016, the composition of Fulton County's population is estimated to be 71.0% White, 23.8% Black/African American, **0.9%** Asian, **2.7%** other and 2 or more races, and **1.7%** Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Fulton County is **projected** to **decrease** by -940 people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Fulton County are projected to increase by 3.8% compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.3



- In 2016, Fulton County's official poverty rate was **30.0%** (23.9% 36.1%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>
- In 2017, there were **3** child care centers in Fulton County. Of these **2** were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 0.9% (+/-0.6%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **12%** people in Fulton County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Fulton County was \$46,558,000.<sup>13</sup>
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **72.4%** was the value of crops and **27.6%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$209,770 compared to \$62,002 for the state. 13
- In Fulton County, there were **143** hired farm labor workers on **53** farms. <sup>13</sup>
- 82.0% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state. 13



- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Fulton County was **31** for goods-producing, **139** for service-providing, and **17** for hospitality & leisure.<sup>18</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the **2,171** (+/- 193) workers ages 16 and over, **52.8%** (+/- 5.3%) worked inside the county, **18.5%** (+/-5.1%) worked outside the county and **28.7%** (+/-5.1%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, **7.3%** (+/-3.3%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/-0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- 43.1% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state. 19

**31.8%** of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).<sup>21</sup>

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated **50** (+/-33) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.<sup>7</sup>
- **30.8%** of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in Fulton County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.<sup>22</sup>
- **686** (+/- 151) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).<sup>7</sup>
