- The estimated food insecurity rate for Gallatin County is **11.9%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores increased by 33.3%, from 3 to 4 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **27.9%** (20.5%-36.3%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 28% of people in Gallatin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- N/A (N/A-N/A) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵



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

In 2016, Gallatin County's official poverty rate was 14.5% (11.3% - 17.7%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸

- In 2017, there were 4 child care centers in Gallatin County. Of these 1 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, **4.5%** (+/-1.0%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that 16% people in Gallatin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰



In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Gallatin County was \$5,651,000.¹³

- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 80.0% was the value of crops and 20.0% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$30,120** compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In Gallatin County, there were **198** hired farm labor workers on **55** farms.¹³
- 92.4% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³




