- The estimated food insecurity rate for Garrard County is **13.3%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 80.0%, from 5 to 1 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **27.3%** (20.3%-34.9%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that **26%** of people in Garrard County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- 8.1% (2.7%-21.9%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵



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

In 2016, Garrard County's official poverty rate was 16.3% (12.9% - 19.7%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸

- In 2017, there were 4 child care centers in Garrard County. Of these 4 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, **2.1%** (+/-1.1%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that 15% people in Garrard County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰



In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Garrard County was \$38,474,000.13

- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 27.2% was the value of crops and 72.8% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$45,416** compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In Garrard County, there were 650 hired farm labor workers on 212 farms.¹³
- 90.3% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³




