

- The estimated food insecurity rate for Grayson County is 16.2%, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 30.8%, from 13 to 9 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **34.0%** (28.7%-39.4%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 26% of people in Grayson County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 15.7% (10.3%-23.3%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>


The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Grayson County increased by 612 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net in migration** of **439** people.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2016, the composition of Grayson County's population is estimated to be 95.9% White, 1.2% Black/African American, **0.2%** Asian, **1.4%** other and 2 or more races, and **1.3%** Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Grayson County is **projected** to **increase** by **131** people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Grayson County are projected to increase by 36.5% compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.3



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

• In 2016, Grayson County's official poverty rate was **22.1%** (18.3% - 25.9%), compared to **18.2%** (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>



- In 2017, there were **8** child care centers in Grayson County. Of these **4** were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 1.7% (+/-0.6%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **15%** people in Grayson County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Grayson County was \$45,663,000.13
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **40.1%** was the value of crops and **59.9%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$31,625 compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Grayson County, there were 739 hired farm labor workers on 272 farms.<sup>13</sup>
- 93.3% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>





- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Grayson County was **111** for goods-producing, **460** for service-providing, and **37** for hospitality & leisure. <sup>18</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the 10,504 (+/- 417) workers ages 16 and over, 66.7% (+/- 3.1%) worked inside the county, 31.1% (+/-1.0%) worked outside the county and 2.2% (+/-1.0%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, **6.9%** (+/-2.4%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- 18.7% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state. 19

**20.2%** of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).<sup>21</sup>

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated 509 (+/-146) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.
- **43.8%** of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in Grayson County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.<sup>22</sup>
- **2,229** (+/- 356) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).<sup>7</sup>
