
The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Greenup County decreased by -1,392 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated <u>net out migration</u> of -859 people.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2016, the composition of Greenup County's population is estimated to be **96.3**% White, **0.8**% Black/African American, **0.5**% Asian, **1.4**% other and 2 or more races, and **1.1**% Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Greenup County is projected to decrease by -832 people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Greenup County are **projected** to **increase** by **33.8%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>



- In 2016, Greenup County's official poverty rate was **17.4%** (14.3% 20.5%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>
- In 2017, there were **11** child care centers in Greenup County. Of these **6** were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 1.5% (+/-0.3%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **16%** people in Greenup County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state. <sup>10</sup>

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Greenup County was \$5,033,000.<sup>13</sup>
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **56.1%** was the value of crops and **43.9%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$11,974 compared to \$62,002 for the state. 13
- In Greenup County, there were **393** hired farm labor workers on **123** farms. <sup>13</sup>
- 92.2% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>





- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Greenup County was **69** for goods-producing, **470** for service-providing, and **41** for hospitality & leisure. <sup>18</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the 13,451 (+/- 542) workers ages 16 and over, 37.6% (+/- 2.5%) worked inside the county, 39.6% (+/-2.1%) worked outside the county and 22.9% (+/-2.1%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, **3.7%** (+/-1.5%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- 21.1% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.<sup>19</sup>

**17.8%** of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).<sup>21</sup>

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated 308 (+/-89) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.<sup>7</sup>
- **54.3%** of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in Greenup County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.<sup>22</sup>
- **2,879** (+/- 471) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).<sup>7</sup>



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Greenup County is 15.0%, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores did not change by 0.0%, from 7 to 7 stores.
- In 2013-2015, 35.1% (31.0%-39.1%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **43**% of people in Greenup County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- **14.1%** (10.2%-19.1%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>
