
The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Hardin County increased by 2,528 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated <u>net out migration</u> of -2,416 people.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2016, the composition of Hardin County's population is estimated to be **76.4%** White, **12.1%** Black/African American, **2.2%** Asian, **3.9%** other and 2 or more races, and **5.4%** Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Hardin County is projected to increase by 10,342 people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Hardin County are **projected** to **increase** by **70.4%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>



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- In 2016, Hardin County's official poverty rate was **13.8%** (11.7% 15.9%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>
- In 2017, there were 60 child care centers in Hardin County. Of these 35 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 7.1% (+/-0.6%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **20%** people in Hardin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Hardin County was \$57,949,000.<sup>13</sup>
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **70.2%** was the value of crops and **29.8%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$42,660 compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Hardin County, there were 984 hired farm labor workers on 278 farms. 13
- 92.3% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>





- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Hardin County was **293** for goods-producing, **2,515** for service-providing, and **231** for hospitality & leisure. <sup>18</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the 50,052 (+/- 1,073) workers ages 16 and over, 80.6% (+/- 1.5%) worked inside the county, 17.5% (+/-0.5%) worked outside the county and 1.8% (+/-0.5%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, **2.8%** (+/-0.7%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- 24.9% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.<sup>19</sup>

**17.5%** of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).<sup>21</sup>

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated 1,412 (+/-291) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.<sup>7</sup>
- **47.1%** of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in Hardin County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.<sup>22</sup>
- **7,294** (+/- 735) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).<sup>7</sup>



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Hardin County is 14.1%, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 29.2%, from 24 to 17 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, 26.1% (22.9%-29.5%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **23**% of people in Hardin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- **14.0%** (10.5%-18.4%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>
