- The estimated food insecurity rate for Jessamine County is **14.1%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 12.5%, from 8 to 7 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **28.6%** (23.2%-34.0%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **31%** of people in Jessamine County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 8.5% (4.4%-15.7%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Jessamine County increased by 4,789 people.<sup>2</sup>

In 2016, Jessamine County's official poverty rate was 15.9% (13.6% - 18.2%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>

- In 2017, there were 26 child care centers in Jessamine County. Of these 14 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, **5.5%** (+/-1.2%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 17% people in Jessamine County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>




