- The estimated food insecurity rate for LaRue County is **13.2%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores increased by 25.0%, from 4 to 5 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **27.8%** (22.3%-34.4%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 26% of people in LaRue County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- 20.0% (9.8%-36.4%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in LaRue County increased by 12 people.²



In 2016, LaRue County's official poverty rate was 16.9% (13.5% - 20.3%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸

- In 2017, there were 7 child care centers in LaRue County. Of these 6 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, **3.8%** (+/-0.8%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that 13% people in LaRue County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰



- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in LaRue County was \$41,877,000.¹³
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 74.3% was the value of crops and 25.7% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$56,517** compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In LaRue County, there were **591** hired farm labor workers on **155** farms.¹³
- **91.1%** of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³




