
### Leslie County Data Profile



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Leslie County is **21.3%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 20.0%, from 5 to 4 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **37.4%** (31.8%-43.4%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 24% of people in Leslie County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- **16.9%** (10.7%-25.6%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Leslie County **decreased** by **-976** people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net out migration** of **-819** people.<sup>4</sup>
- American, 0.2% Asian, 1.1% other and 2 or more races, and 0.6% Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Leslie County is **projected** to **decrease** by **-829** people.<sup>3</sup>
- County are **projected** to **increase** by **31.8%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>





In 2016, Leslie County's official poverty rate was **31.8%** (25.4% - 38.2%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>

- In 2017, there were 6 child care centers in Leslie County. Of these 6 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 0.7% (+/-0.7%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **9%** people in Leslie County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>

- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$6,997** compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Leslie County, there were **2** hired farm labor workers on **1** farms.<sup>13</sup>
- **80.0%** of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>




