- The estimated food insecurity rate for Lyon County is **12.9%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores did not change by 0.0%, from 1 to 1 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **29.3%** (22.9%-36.7%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 22% of people in Lyon County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 5.1% (1.0%-23.1%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>



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

In 2016, Lyon County's official poverty rate was 16.4% (13.1% - 19.7%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>

- In 2017, there were 2 child care centers in Lyon County. Of these 2 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, **3.7%** (+/-1.4%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.<sup>7</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **14%** people in Lyon County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>



In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Lyon County was \$6,782,000.<sup>13</sup>

- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 78.0% was the value of crops and 22.0% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$37,150** compared to \$62,002 for the state.<sup>13</sup>
- In Lyon County, there were **115** hired farm labor workers on **53** farms.<sup>13</sup>
- 90.4% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>




