- The estimated food insecurity rate for Martin County is **20.8%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores did not change by 0.0%, from 4 to 4 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **30.9%** (24.1%-37.9%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 42% of people in Martin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- 17.1% (9.4%-29.1%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵



In 2016, Martin County's official poverty rate was 39.3% (30.8% - 47.8%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸

- In 2017, there were 0 child care centers in Martin County. Of these 0 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, 2.5% (+/-0.9%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that 9% people in Martin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰





- Between 2012 and 2016, 6.2% (+/-3.7%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.⁷
- 44.2% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.¹⁹
