
The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Martin County decreased by -1,477 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated <u>net out migration</u> of -1,398 people.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2016, the composition of Martin County's population is estimated to be **88.6**% White, **6.7**% Black/African American, **0.2**% Asian, **1.1**% other and 2 or more races, and **3.5**% Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Martin County is projected to decrease by -393 people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Martin County are **projected** to **increase** by **47.0%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.<sup>3</sup>




- In 2016, Martin County's official poverty rate was **39.3%** (30.8% 47.8%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>
- In 2017, there were 0 child care centers in Martin County. Of these 0 were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 2.5% (+/-0.9%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **9%** people in Martin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Martin County was \$95,000.<sup>13</sup>
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, N/A was the value of crops and N/A was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$39,590 compared to \$62,002 for the state. 13
- In Martin County, there were 1 hired farm labor workers on 1 farms. 13
- 95.0% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.<sup>13</sup>



- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Martin County was 22 for goods-producing, 160 for service-providing, and 12 for hospitality & leisure. 18
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the **2,592** (+/- 324) workers ages 16 and over, **53.7%** (+/- 8.8%) worked inside the county, **19.8%** (+/-7.6%) worked outside the county and **26.5%** (+/-7.6%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, **6.2%** (+/-3.7%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- 44.2% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.<sup>19</sup>

**34.6%** of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).<sup>21</sup>

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated 128 (+/-73) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.
- **31.2%** of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in Martin County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.<sup>22</sup>
- **1,306** (+/- 243) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).<sup>7</sup>



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Martin County is 20.8%, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>did not change</u> by 0.0%, from 4 to 4 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, 30.9% (24.1%-37.9%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 42% of people in Martin County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- **17.1%** (9.4%-29.1%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>
