Definitions of who is counted as a veteran varies by data source. These data are from the Census Bureau who defines veterans this way: "A "civilian veteran" is a person 18 years old or over who has served (even for a short time), but is not now serving, on active duty in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, or the Coast Guard, or who served in the U.S. Merchant Marine during World War II. People who served in the National Guard or military Reserves are classified as veterans only if they were ever called or ordered to active duty, not counting the 4-6 months for initial training or yearly summer camps. All other civilians 16 years old and over are classified as nonveterans."

For counties with small populations and small population groups, the margins of error (indicated by a +/-\_\_\_) can be quite large.

The <u>margin of error</u> tells us how precise the estimate is by indicating the <u>range within which the estimate most likely falls</u>.

The 2023 American Community Survey 5-year estimates (2019-2023) that there were 235,118 (+/- 3,869) veterans in Kentucky. 


