

- The estimated food insecurity rate for Oldham County is 8.0%, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 33.3%, from 6 to 4 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **24.0%** (19.2%-29.5%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 18% of people in Oldham County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole. 10
- 8.6% (4.5%-15.7%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵


The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Oldham County increased by 6,099 people.²
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net in migration** of **5,032** people.⁴
- In 2016, the composition of Oldham County's population is estimated to be 88.4% White, 4.4% Black/African American, 1.6% Asian, 1.7% other and 2 or more races, and 3.9% Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Oldham County is **projected** to **increase** by **8,391** people.³
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Oldham County are projected to increase by 115.6% compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.³



- In 2017, there were 33 child care centers in Oldham County. Of these 20 were STARS certified.9



- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Oldham County was \$14,849,000.¹³
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 61.4% was the value of crops and 38.6% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$45,209 compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In Oldham County, there were **334** hired farm labor workers on **127** farms. ¹³
- 81.2% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state. 13



• In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Oldham County was 272 for goods-producing, 1,238 for service-providing, and 116 for hospitality & leisure.¹⁸

Women

- Between 2012 and 2016, of the 29,135 (+/- 596) workers ages 16 and over, 33.2% (+/- 1.7%) worked inside the county, **63.8%** (+/-0.6%) worked outside the county and **3.0%** (+/-0.6%) worked outside Kentucky.⁷
- Between 2012 and 2016, **1.5%** (+/-0.5%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.⁷
- **0.5%** of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.¹⁹



16.1% of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).²¹

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated **641** (+/-132) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.⁷
- 54.6% of 3rd grade students in Oldham County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.²²
- 1,689 (+/- 370) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).⁷
