
Owen County Data Profile



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Owen County is **12.9%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 33.3%, from 3 to 2 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **35.6%** (28.2%-43.2%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 33% of people in Owen County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- 18.0% (7.5%-37.2%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Owen County decreased by -76 people.²
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net in migration** of **1** people.⁴
- American, 0.2% Asian, 1.4% other and 2 or more races, and 2.6% Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Owen County is **projected** to **decrease** by -601 people.³
- County are **projected** to **increase** by **45.4%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.³



In 2016, Owen County's official poverty rate was 18.2% (14.8% - 21.6%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸

- In 2017, there were 2 child care centers in Owen County. Of these 2 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, **0.8%** (+/-0.6%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that 11% people in Owen County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰



- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Owen County was \$21,239,000.¹³
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 49.3% was the value of crops and 50.7% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$29,221** compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In Owen County, there were **512** hired farm labor workers on **155** farms.¹³
- 89.0% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³

* A farm must sell at least \$5,000 to be defined as a farm operation.



- 22.5% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.¹⁹


