- The estimated food insecurity rate for Owsley County is **21.7%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores increased by 100.0%, from 1 to 2 stores.<sup>16</sup>
- In 2013-2015, **29.3%** (22.9%-36.1%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that **21%** of people in Owsley County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 22.0% (11.8%-37.4%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>

- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Owsley County is **projected** to **decrease** by **-310** people.<sup>3</sup>

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




