

- The estimated food insecurity rate for Perry County is **19.3%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by **30.0%**, from **10** to **7** stores. ¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, 32.7% (28.7%-37.1%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that **25%** of people in Perry County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- **13.9%** (10.1%-18.8%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵


The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Perry County <u>decreased</u> by **-2,159** people.²
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated net out migration of -2,032 people.⁴
- In 2016, the composition of Perry County's population is estimated to be **95.6%** White, **1.5%** Black/African American, **0.5%** Asian, **1.4%** other and 2 or more races, and **1.0%** Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Perry County is projected to decrease by -782 people.³
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Perry County are **projected** to **increase** by **38.3%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.³







- In 2016, Perry County's official poverty rate was **30.9%** (26.0% 35.8%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.8
- In 2017, there were 10 child care centers in Perry County. Of these 9 were STARS certified.9
- Between 2012-2016, 1.5% (+/-1.0%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that 11% people in Perry County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state. 10

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Perry County was \$2,062,000.13
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 7.3% was the value of crops and 92.7% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$34,581 compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In Perry County, there were N/A hired farm labor workers on 16 farms. 13
- 87.8% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state. 13




- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Perry County was 51 for goods-producing, 702 for service-providing, and 42 for hospitality & leisure. 18
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the **8,389** (+/- 473) workers ages 16 and over, **83.6%** (+/- 2.8%) worked inside the county, **14.6%** (+/-0.9%) worked outside the county and **1.8%** (+/-0.9%) worked outside Kentucky.⁷
- Between 2012 and 2016, 5.2% (+/-1.8%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/- 0.1%) for the state as a whole.⁷
- **44.4%** of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.¹⁹

32.4% of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).²¹

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated 441 (+/-128) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.⁷
- **45.0%** of 3rd grade students in Perry County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.²²
- 2,940 (+/- 399) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).⁷
