- The estimated food insecurity rate for Robertson County is **15.6%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 50.0%, from 2 to 1 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **28.9%** (21.2%-35.9%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that N/A of people in Robertson County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Robertson County **decreased** by **-148** people.²
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net out migration** of **-83** people.⁴




