

- The estimated food insecurity rate for Shelby County is **11.3%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.<sup>27</sup>
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 40.0%, from 10 to 6 stores. 16
- In 2013-2015, 27.4% (22.0%-33.5%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.<sup>24</sup>
- The Urban Institute estimates that 29% of people in Shelby County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.<sup>10</sup>
- 10.3% (5.6%-18.3%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.<sup>25</sup>


The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:

- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Shelby County increased by 5,347 people.<sup>2</sup>
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated **net in migration** of **3,375** people.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2016, the composition of Shelby County's population is estimated to be 80.4% White, 7.1% Black/African American, 1.1% Asian, 2.3% other and 2 or more races, and 9.1% Hispanic.<sup>5</sup>
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Shelby County is projected to increase by 7,216 people.<sup>3</sup>
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Shelby County are projected to increase by 88.0% compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.3





- In 2016, Shelby County's official poverty rate was **11.5%** (9.4% 13.6%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.<sup>8</sup>
- In 2017, there were **32** child care centers in Shelby County. Of these **23** were STARS certified.<sup>9</sup>
- Between 2012-2016, 9.4% (+/-0.8%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **18%** people in Shelby County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.<sup>10</sup>

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Shelby County was \$76,804,000.13
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **71.4%** was the value of crops and **28.6%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.<sup>13</sup>
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$51,690 compared to \$62,002 for the state. 13
- In Shelby County, there were 1,677 hired farm labor workers on 439 farms.<sup>13</sup>
- 86.5% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state. 13




- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Shelby County was **194** for goods-producing, **897** for service-providing, and **85** for hospitality & leisure. <sup>18</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the 21,050 (+/- 639) workers ages 16 and over, 51.9% (+/- 2.4%) worked inside the county, 46.9% (+/-0.6%) worked outside the county and 1.2% (+/-0.6%) worked outside Kentucky.<sup>7</sup>
- Between 2012 and 2016, **2.4%** (+/-0.9%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/-0.1%) for the state as a whole.<sup>7</sup>
- 33.8% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state. 19
