- The estimated food insecurity rate for Union County is **17.8%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 28.6%, from 7 to 5 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **30.0%** (24.4%-36.0%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 27% of people in Union County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- 9.5% (4.4%-19.1%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵



- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Union County decreased by -339 people.²
- In 2016, the composition of Union County's population is estimated to be 81.9% White, 13.4% Black/African American, 0.8% Asian, 1.9% other and 2 or more races, and 1.9% Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Union County is **projected** to **decrease** by -14 people.³



• In 2016, Union County's official poverty rate was 18.6% (15.4% - 21.8%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸

- In 2017, there were 8 child care centers in Union County. Of these 5 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, **2.0%** (+/-0.6%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that **11%** people in Union County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰



- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Union County was \$96,493,000.¹³
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, 92.3% was the value of crops and 7.7% was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$272,094** compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In Union County, there were **293** hired farm labor workers on **80** farms.¹³
- 83.6% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³




