
The overall goals for the Community Assessments are:


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Wayne County decreased by -97 people.²
- Between April 2010 and June 2017, there was an estimated <u>net out migration</u> of -219 people.⁴
- In 2016, the composition of Wayne County's population is estimated to be **93.5**% White, **1.6**% Black/African American, **0.4**% Asian, **1.5**% other and 2 or more races, and **3.0**% Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Wayne County is projected to decrease by -926 people.³
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Wayne County are **projected** to **increase** by **42.8%** compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.³



- In 2016, Wayne County's official poverty rate was **26.9%** (21.8% 32.0%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸
- In 2017, there were 15 child care centers in Wayne County. Of these 12 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, 2.8% (+/-0.9%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.
- The Urban Institute estimates that **11%** people in Wayne County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state. ¹⁰

- In 2012, the total market value of agricultural products sold in Wayne County was \$68,072,000.¹³
- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **17.2%** was the value of crops and **82.8%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was \$91,321 compared to \$62,002 for the state. 13
- In Wayne County, there were 847 hired farm labor workers on 204 farms.¹³
- 94.6% of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³





- In 2017, the number of private establishments covered by unemployment insurance in Wayne County was **55** for goods-producing, **249** for service-providing, and **29** for hospitality & leisure. ¹⁸
- Between 2012 and 2016, of the 6,513 (+/- 475) workers ages 16 and over, 73.0% (+/- 4.7%) worked inside the county, 25.0% (+/-1.6%) worked outside the county and 2.0% (+/-1.6%) worked outside Kentucky.⁷
- Between 2012 and 2016, **4.2%** (+/-2.0%) of workers ages 16 and over who worked full-time year round were below poverty compared to 3.5% (+/-0.1%) for the state as a whole.⁷
- 23.9% of 2016 HS graduates in the county earned an industry certificate compared to 19.2% for the state.¹⁹

19.0% of students entered KY public postsecondary institutions underprepared in one or more subjects (2015).²¹

- Between 2012-2016, there were an estimated 192 (+/-109) youth ages 5-17 who had a disability.⁷
- **44.6%** of 3rd grade students in Wayne County scored proficient or distinguished on math in the 2015-16 school year compared to 47.7% for the state.²²
- **1,949** (+/- 310) youth under age 18 lived in households that received supplemental security income (SSI), cash public assistance, or food stamps/SNAP in the past 12 months (2012-2016).⁷



- The estimated food insecurity rate for Wayne County is 17.1%, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 42.9%, from 7 to 4 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, 34.5% (29.0%-40.3%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that **34%** of people in Wayne County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- **21.6%** (14.8%-30.5%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵
