- The estimated food insecurity rate for Webster County is **14.8%**, compared to 15.5% for the state.²⁷
- From 2010 to 2016, the number of grocery stores <u>decreased</u> by 62.5%, from 8 to 3 stores.¹⁶
- In 2013-2015, **32.9%** (26.7%-40.4%) of adults ages 20 and over reported no leisure time physical activity.²⁴
- The Urban Institute estimates that 25% of people in Webster County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had medical debt in collections compared to 27% for the state as a whole.¹⁰
- 13.4% (5.2%-30.1%) of adults reported that there was a time in past year when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost.²⁵


- From 2010 to 2017, the total population in Webster County decreased by -603 people.²
- In 2016, the composition of Webster County's population is estimated to be 88.6% White, 3.8% Black/African American, 0.4% Asian, 1.9% other and 2 or more races, and 5.3% Hispanic.⁵
- From 2017 to 2025, the total population in Webster County is **projected** to **decrease** by **-1,060** people.³
- As baby boomers are entering retirement, between 2010 and 2025 the population ages 65 and over in Webster County are projected to increase by 23.6% compared to 51.9% for the state as a whole.³

In 2016, Webster County's official poverty rate was 17.9% (14.8% - 21.0%), compared to 18.2% (17.9% - 18.6%) for the state as a whole.⁸

- In 2017, there were 4 child care centers in Webster County. Of these 2 were STARS certified.⁹
- Between 2012-2016, **5.8%** (+/-1.2%) of people ages 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home.⁷
- The Urban Institute estimates that **9%** people in Webster County with a credit bureau record in 2016 had student loan debt compared to 16% for the state.¹⁰

- Of the total market value of agricultural products sold, **43.3%** was the value of crops and **56.7%** was the value of livestock, poultry, and their products.¹³
- The total farm production expenses (average per farm) was **\$160,543** compared to \$62,002 for the state.¹³
- In Webster County, there were **344** hired farm labor workers on **117** farms.¹³
- **91.8%** of farms were operated by a family or an individual compared to 91.0% for the state.¹³




