The idea for the volumes came because of a request from the conference program chair, Keiko Tanaka, that artifacts from the history of the Society be on display during the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. Given the fragile nature of the original documents and a need to contextualize their importance, a decision was made to create this series of display volumes.

Most of the documents included herein were originally copied from the RSS Archives for the 6-part series on the history of the Rural Sociological Society written by John Holik and Edward Hassinger for the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of RSS. The series was published in *The Rural Sociologist*.



Recognized as the first international conference on rural sociology, the First World Congress of Rural Sociology was held in 1964 [**Tab 1**]. The conference was organized by the Committee for International Cooperation in Rural Sociology which contained representatives from both the Rural Sociological Society (RSS) and the European Society for Rural Sociology (ESRS) [**Tab 8**].

The Committee for International Cooperation in Rural Sociology had been formed two years earlier in 1962 [Tab 7]. At that time, the goal was to develop a multi-national conference on rural sociology. The Committee's first members were:

Chair: E. W. Hofstee (the Netherlands)

Vice-Chairman: Olaf F. Larson (U. S.)

Members: H. Kotter (Federal Republic of Germany)

H. E. Bracey (Great Britain) Harold Kaufman (U. S.) Robert. A. Polson (U. S.)

In 1969, the Latin American Rural Sociological Association (ALASRU) was formed and representatives from that association were added to the Committee for International Cooperation in Rural Sociology.

At the 1970 meeting of the ESRS, a Preparatory Committee was appointed to develop a Constitution and begin the process of forming an international association. Members of the Preparatory Committee included the presidents of the three existing regional societies: Odd Grande from Norway (ESRS), Glenn Fuguitt from the U.S. (RSS), and Jose Pastore from Brazil (ALASRU).

At the 3<sup>rd</sup> World Congress in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, additional members were sought from nations where no professional organizations existed. As a result, Bruce Crouch from Australia (representing Oceania), Gelia Castillo from the Philippines (representing Asia), and E. B. E. Ndem from Zambia (representing Africa) were added to the Committee.

In August of 1976, the 4th World Congress was held in Torun, Poland. In the months leading up to the conference, a Constitution was drafted and ratified by the regional societies. The 5th World Congress of Rural Sociology held in Mexico City, Mexico was the first Congress organized by the International Rural Sociology Association

This year, 2012, marks the 13th World Congress of Rural Sociology. It will be held in Lisbon, Portugal.


