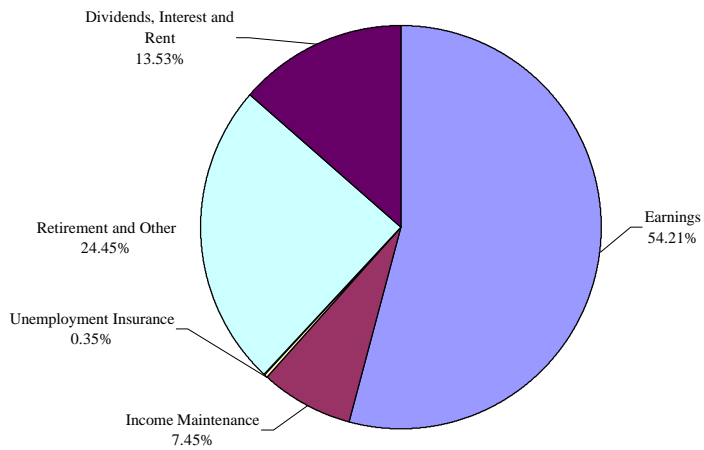

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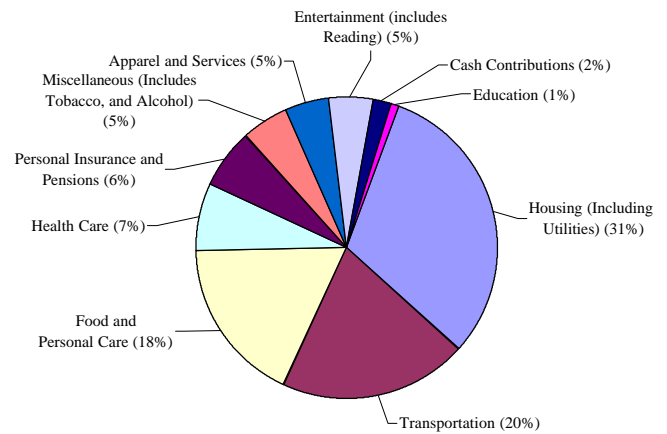
**Martin County

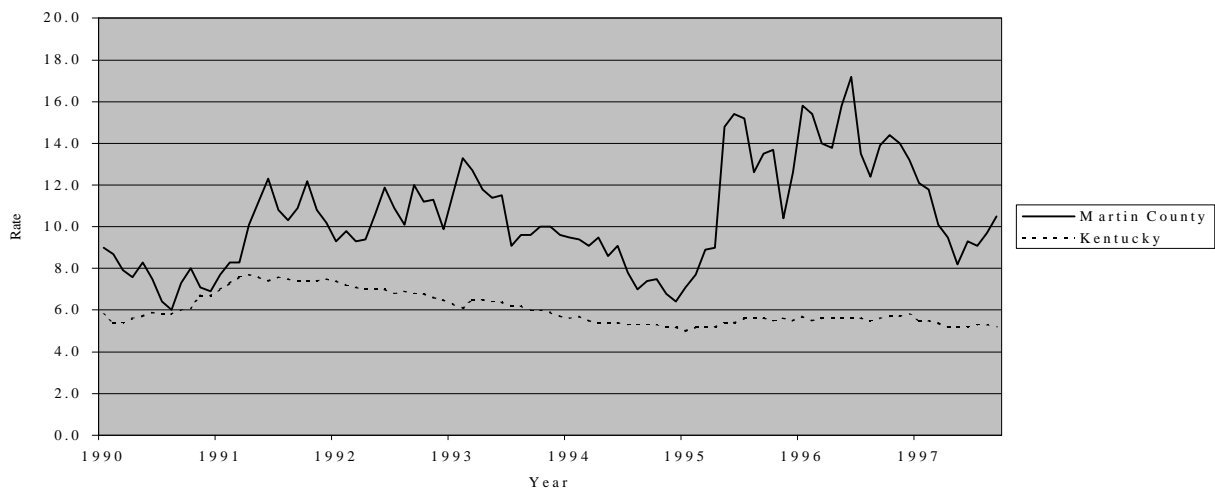
**Average Household Expenditures: Southern Region,

(Data are not specific to this county, but are for the same income group in the Southern Region as the median income estimated in 1993 for this county.)

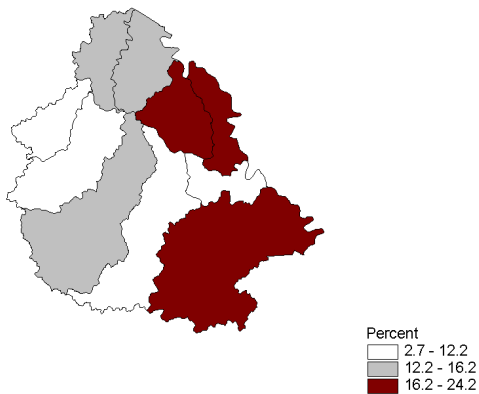

Monthly Unemployment Rates, 1990-1997

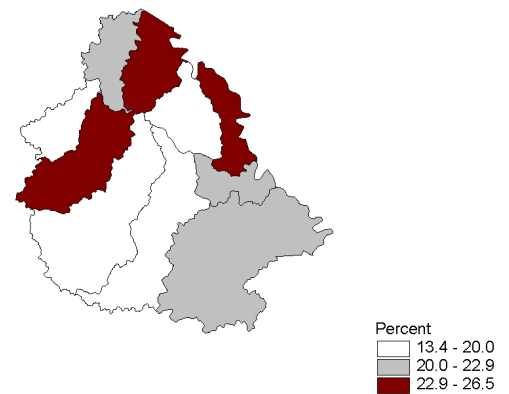


**Households Without Personal Transportation

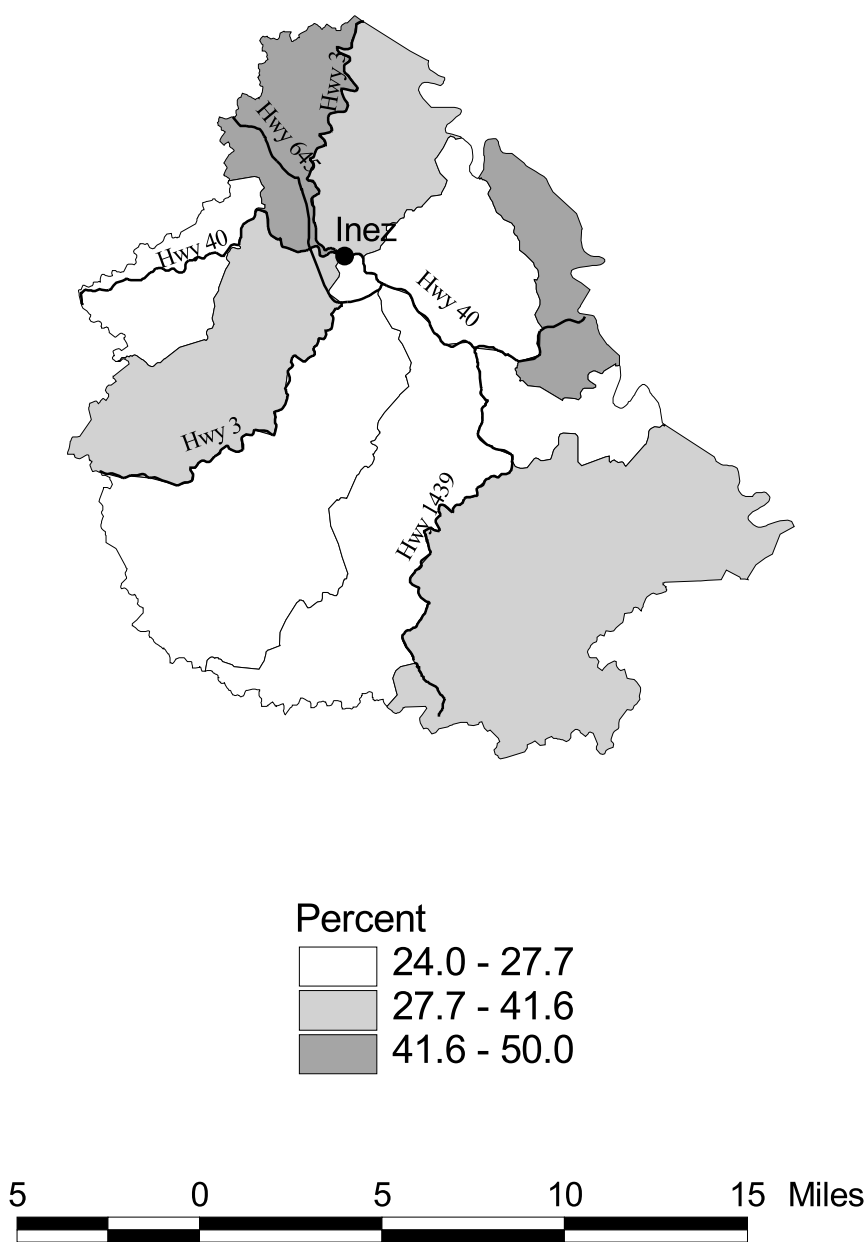
**Households Without Telephones
