For the years in between Decennial Censuses (conducted every 10 years), the U.S. Census Bureau produces official population estimates. Using data such as the number of births, deaths, and other records, the Census Bureau produces official estimates of the total population, population by age, sex, race/ethnicity, and the estimated change due to births, deaths, and net migration (called "components of population change"). This issue of Kentucky: By The Numbers provides the current estimates of how much of the estimated population change was due to births, deaths, and migration from the 2010 Census (April 1, 2010) to July 1, 2011.
